Valletta Contemporary (VC) will be Malta's premier space for contemporary art – it will showcase the best in local work, as well as a world-class programme of international artists.

VC promises to be more than just another gallery for galleristas. It will be a place for Malta's diverse cultural community, championing contemporary art as a catalyst for discussion, social cohesion, and cultural discovery.

The gallery will support works marked by originality and experimentation in diverse mediums and themes, and will make quality and excellence in the practice and appreciation of contemporary art its core driver. Its diverse programme will include collaborations with local and international institutions and collectors, regular outreach programmes, and knowledge-sharing initiatives. VC will work with both practicing artists and the local community to create a new hub for viewing art and learning about

contemporary ideas and theory. It will bring contemporary art into mainstream consciousness by appealing as much to art lovers as it will to new-comers. Its shop will be stacked with products and books from emerging local and international artists, and its adjoining cafe will be a go-to venue for great food mixed with new, energised discussions.

A new cultural quarter for Valletta

Located at the lower East end of Valletta – on the city's periphery and away from the main centre – VC will play an important role in the regeneration of a lesser known part of the city. It will merge past with present – offering contemporary art in a city with a rich historical background. The merging of history and the now will also be reflected in the gallery's architecture – engaging the new with the old whilst retaining the latter's fundamental aesthetic character.


Exposure with a growing, international audience



An eclectic and exciting calendar of events

VC's exciting programme of events will be accompanied by thoughtful and far-reaching marketing and publicity campaigns. Our message will be filtered through both local and international press, active social media content, and an engaging and insightful blog.

The gallery will work hard to ensure that marketing and communications opportunities are maximised, and that exhibiting artists and curators are closely associated with the reputation of the gallery. VC's programme will reflect a centre which places quality, innovation, and avant-garde curating at its core.

VC's annual calendar of exhibitions and ancillary events will showcase the very best art from local and international artists, whose work broadly embraces a contemporary idiom. It will exhibit contemporary art in its various expressions, showcasing diverse disciplines, mediums and themes. Highlights of the gallery's programme will include:

- A series of world-class solo and collective exhibitions.
- Residencies organised to encourage the professionalisation and advancement of young artists.
- Networking events enabling the development of an international pool of artists and art practitioners (curators, critics, reviewers, etc).
- Events encouraging the local general public and tourists to engage with artists and their work (Q&As, lectures).
- A gallery store intended to support upcoming and emerging Maltese artists by facilitating the sale of artworks and art merchandise.
- An adjoining cafe which will accommodate daily visitors, as well as provide catering and a desirable space for special events.

VC will be a venue of excellence where Malta's cultural community can experience contemporary artworks in their various forms and manifestations.



In turn, the gallery will ensure to diversify its programme in order for it to reach out to all corners of Malta's cultural community – the young, the old, students and professionals – providing opportunities for each of them to enjoy and engage with different artists and their work.

META FOUNDATION & COLLABORATORS

The META Foundation members.

The META Foundation is the brainchild of founder Norbert Francis Attard, an artist who has been practicing his art for more than fifty years.

The META Foundation was set up to run the premises of VC, and to provide the policy guidelines and support necessary to do so. Its main objective is to promote contemporary art, particularly by showcasing all the disciplines in the visual arts, including architecture and design.

Gallery Director: Norbert Francis Attard

Born in Malta in 1951, Norbert lives and works on the island of Gozo (Malta) and has also been based in Berlin (Germany) since 2010. He graduated with an architecture degree from the University of Malta in 1977, becoming a practicing architect for 20 years until 1996. He moved to Germany in 1978 till 1979, where he worked with Licht in Raum, directed by Johannes Dinnebier, one of Germany's pioneers in light design. Norbert then worked as a self-taught painter and graphic designer (1965-1997) before moving to multi-media, site-specific and context-driven works in 1997. His present practice employs several disciplines including architecture, sculpture, video and photography, to explore his major interest – places and their memories.

His art deliberately combines social, cultural, political, scientific and religious themes with a bold arrangement of unorthodox materials, meticulously constructed with an architect's disciplined eve for detail. He investigates elements of irony, duality, dichotomy and ambivalence, and deliberately combines every-day materials and found objects in diverse manners. He represented Malta in the 48th Venice Biennale in 1999. He is a founding member of stART (2002) - a group of Maltese contemporary artists; a committee member of the Malta Council for Culture and the Arts (2002-2005); a committee member of Piazza Teatru Rial since May 2013, and director of GOZO Contemporary since 2001.

Michael Fenech

Michael graduated as a teacher in 1981 and served as manager at the Manoel Theatre before helping set up San Anton School – where he was Headmaster until 1996. In 1991 he was awarded a Masters in Education by the University of Malta, where he has lectured on Democracy and Education, Between 2003 and 2013, he served as Chairman of St James Cavalier Centre for Creativity and now runs the management development company, Ideas Alive Ltd. Michael writes, directs and produces various events including the annual festival of political satire Bla Kondixin. He has been involved in theatre and TV since 1979, directing numerous theatre and TV productions over a period of 30 vears. In 1981 he co-founded Ateatru. an experimental/political theatre group. He also studied Fine Arts at MCAST. In 2013. Michael read for a Masters in Culture Criticism and Curating from The University of the Arts in London.

Victor Sladden

Victor graduated as an architect from the University of Malta in 1983. In 2014 he was appointed Assistant Director Development Services at the Malta Environment Planning Authority. Between 2004 and 2007, he was Technical Adviser for the Valletta Local Council. In 1997 he was awarded a Masters in Environmental Management from the University of Central England. Victor is an art collector with a special interest in modern and contemporary art and design.

Marisa Vella

Born in 1960, Marisa has for the last 20 years, been House Manager of the tourist holiday complex, *Tal-Mirakli*, in Għarb, Gozo. As well as having managerial skills, she is also experienced in book keeping and accounts. She has been assisting Norbert Francis Attard in his artistic projects for the last 26 years.

In its endoeavour to bring VC gallery to fruition, the META Foundation has worked with Local Council, Alexei Dingli wrote. "[It some of Malta's most forward-thinking and culturally-invested institutions.

The META Foundation has signed a threeyear collaboration agreement with the Fondazzioni Ċentru Għall-Kreattivitá of the St. James Cavalier Center for Creativity, as well as a cultural partnership agreement with the Malta Arts Council. The strength of these working relationships will act as the keystone in the growth of the gallery to international standards of excellence.

A handful of high-profile endorsments

Aside from these collaborative agreements, VC gallery has received critical support from Valletta's key cultural stakeholders. Each of these figures are invested in the progression of Valletta's cultural development, and - as such - the gallery's success.

"Valletta Contemporary will be an exciting site for discovery," Mayor of Valletta will be] a gathering place in which to experience and enjoy contemporary visual culture [...] we will be very glad to offer this project our fullest support".

Kenneth Gambin, CEO of Heritage Malta believes that the VC gallery will "plug an obvious gap of any such outlet in Valletta." He expresses Heritage Malta's support of the gallery and its ambition to "showcase and celebrate the art of our time".

Chairman of Valletta 2018, Jason Micallef, believes that the vision of the gallery will align with Valletta's own trajectory, and "enhance our capital's already rich cultural heritage". Whilst Rupert Cefai, Chairman of St. James Cavalier Center for Creativity, acknowledges that VC will be "an important addition to [Malta's] visitor attractions".



European Capital of Culture: Valletta 2018.

Valletta was declared European Capital of Culture (ECoC) on the 12th October 2012. The Valletta 2018 Foundation has since been responsible for the bid and implementation of this prestigious project.

Valletta will be hosting the title of European Capital of Culture in 2018 with a partner Dutch city, Leeuwarden. The ECoC includes all the Maltese islands, with an aim to spread its impact throughout the whole country.

Valletta 2018's cultural programme aims to promote the city's place in Europe's wider cultural context, and encourage citizen participation on an island-wide scale. This will be an unprecedented cultural event for Malta, enabling the participation local and foreign artists and creatives, who will each form an integral and sustainable part of the long-term social, economic and cultural development of Malta. The cultural programme is built around four themes: Generations, Routes, Cities and Islands. In parallel, Valletta2018 has developed a programme of consistent, accessible and comparable research and evaluation directly linked to culture.

A serendipitous opening

The VC gallery will open in the same year of Valletta's term as the ECoC, and thus form part of a national climactic moment for the arts. Not only will the gallery's opening collide with a historic moment in time for the capital, but it will also benefit from an increased footfall in the city, as well as the culturally-inclined wave of tourism that such an event is bound to attract.

Artist residency programme.

VC's director, Norbert Francis Attard, has been at the helm of Gozo Contemporary since 2001. The institution has hosted a number of artist residencies, each bringing forth new opportunities for the island's art scene to mature and flourish.

Gozo Contemporary aims at introducing artists and organisations to Malta's sister island of Gozo. This small and tranquil island is home to a unique and creative environment that has inspired artists for more than 7000 years. Gozo Contemporary's ongoing mission is to champion the island as a meeting place for creative people from around the globe – an inspirational hub for both Maltese and international artists alike.

This multi-functional space has, and will continue to, host talented artists - providing them with a working and living space to reside in. These residencies are intended as professional development opportunities for emerging contemporary artists, a place where they are especially encouraged to work on collaborative projects or work involving interdisciplinary activity. Whilst all mediums are permissible within the Gozo Contemporary residencies, installation, performance, literature, music and video art are mediums that are particularly encouraged.

Gozo Contemporary meets Valletta Contemporary

Under Attard's directorship, both the Gozo institution and the gallery in Valletta will seek to engender opportunities for artists' residencies. The two centres will work in synthesis to carve unique and nurturing avenues for artists who are looking for the next step in their career.



A historic building.


The establishment of the VC gallery has one overriding aim: to broaden the scope of cultural heritage in Malta. But equally as important is its position as a new and innovative attraction to the country's capital.

VC will take advantage of the under-utilised market of contemporary art in Malta, whist preserving and promoting traditional characteristics and values through the fabric of its built context. Its chief purpose will be to address the need for the establishment of a museum for modern and contemporary art, but the sensitive design of its premises will also serve to transform the surrounding urban environment into a cultural and artistic hub.

The project is an investment in a Maltese cultural and historical asset which shall be directly contributing towards the economy and the tourism sector. The building's contemporary interiors have been designed to celebrate the historic building that contains it - juxtaposing sleek, crisp materiality with the stunning original features of the vaulted Valletta property its built within. VC will be known an inspiring addition to Valletta's architectural legacy.
